Good and Well

Good is usually used as an adjective.

A good name is rather to be chosen than great riches,
God saw that His creation was good.
Wait on the Lord: be of good courage.

Well may be an adjective or an adverb. As an adjective, it refers to one's health. As an adverb, it means how something is done.

adjective: Joshua was not feeling well this morning.
adverb: Marilyn can draw very well.

To decide whether to use *good* or *well*, ask yourself which word it is modifying; then decide if you need an adjective or adverb.

A colon is used to introduce a series of items. Often, but not always, the words “as follows” or “the following” will be in the sentence prior to the list of items.

Mary bought the following: milk, sugar, eggs, and cheese.

The following students had perfect attendance: Stacy, Annette, and Kyle.

These men faithfully served Christ: Abraham, John, and Paul.

Do not use a colon after a verb.

Wrong → Jeff's favorite foods are: hot dogs, watermelon, and ice cream.

Right → Jeff's favorite foods are hot dogs, watermelon, and ice cream.

Do not use a colon after a preposition. Keep the object with its preposition.

Wrong → The casserole was made of: macaroni, tuna, milk, and cheese.

Right → The casserole was made of macaroni, tuna, milk, and cheese.
